The Community Arts Awards started in 1985 and have given the ACGK the opportunity to recognize and honor local artists and arts organizations as well as supporters.

About the Awards

Community Medal of Arts

The Community Medal of Arts recognizes an artist who has a significant body of creative activity, is a leader in their field, has received local and/or national acclaim, and has impacted our community through art. This award is given out to an artist only once in their career. It encompasses all forms of art, including, but not limited to, visual, musical, theatrical, literary, performing, multi-media, architecture, and design.

Theodore C. Cooper Award for Distinguished Volunteer Service

The recipient of the Theodore C. Cooper Award for Distinguished Volunteer Service honors a person, persons, or group whose lives exemplify a broad range of service to the arts community that is not related to his/her/their professional occupation.

Adam F. Carter Young Artist Award

Focusing on young artists, the award named for Adam F. Carter recognizes and encourages the next generation of artists in our community. This recipient should be a rising high school senior (although rising juniors and college freshmen will also be considered), who has had an impact in both their artistic field of study and in our community. The winner will receive a monetary scholarship to be used to further their artistic study. Nominations will be accepted by the student's teacher, director, instructor, or community member. The scholarship is generously supported by the Mary and Brooks Godfrey Family.

Patron Award

The Patron Award acknowledges an individual or couple who has significantly contributed to the arts as patrons and have made a sustained and/or transformational impact in this community through their support of the arts and patronage.

Business Arts Award

Presented to honor businesses in our community for their leadership, commitment, and vision in developing exemplary alliances with artists and arts organizations, the Business Arts Award recognizes a business for creating outstanding initiatives with artists and arts organizations, furthering the educational development of youth, enhancing the economic vitality of the community, and enriching the quality of life in our community.

Epic Award

The Epic Award recognizes a non-profit organization or program in our community that is of high artistic quality and serves to enhance life in our community through the arts. The award pays special attention to both long-standing programs and organizations that have played a consistent role in the community and new organizations and programs that meet a previously unmet community need or focus area.

Gayle Hoogstraten Arts Leadership Awards

Named after the first full-time Executive Director of the Arts Council of Greater Kalamazoo, the Gayle Hoogstraten Arts Leadership Awards award recognize leaders in our community in two categories: Arts Education and Arts Administration. Recipients of this award demonstrate a proven track record of strong impact on the community and participants in art far beyond his/her job description. They will also have established positive and productive relationships in the community outside of his/her institution.
